एम.ए. (बौद्ध अध्ययन)

एम.ए. (बौद्ध अध्ययन) पाठ्यक्रम पूर्णकालिक द्विवर्षीय पाठ्यक्रम है। यह पाठ्यक्रम चार सत्रार्द्धों (Semesters) तथा दो वर्षों के क्रम में विभक्त है। प्रथम वर्ष में सत्रार्द्ध I व II तथा द्वितीय वर्ष में सत्रार्द्ध III व IV का अध्यापन किया जायेगा। पाठ्यक्रम के अन्तर्गत व्याख्यानों, संगोष्ठियों, प्रायोगिक-कार्यों, ट्यूटोरियल्स तथा प्रदत्त-कार्यों (Assignments) आदि के माध्यम से अध्यापन किया जायेगा। प्रत्येक सत्रार्द्ध में बौद्ध अध्ययन विषय के चार-चार प्रश्न-पत्र होंगे। प्रत्येक प्रश्न-पत्र के लिए पाँच इकाइयाँ (Units) तथा 3 क्रेडिट्स निर्धारित होंगे।

The academic program facilitating Master of Arts (M.A.) degree in Buddhist Studies will focus on the study of issues related to Origin & Development of Buddhism, Pāli Language, Buddhist literature, Buddhist Art & Architecture, Buddhist Epigraphy, Tibetan & Chinese Buddhism, The Social Philosophy of Buddhism, Buddhist philosophy, Buddhist meditation, Modern Thinkers of Buddhism etc. This program will also cover the issues related to spread of Buddhism in different parts of the world.

Duration:	2 years (4 Semesters)
Minimum Qualification for Admission:	Graduate Degree should be in any discipline. The admission will be given as per the rules of BRAUSS and UGC. Reservations in the admission will be fulfilled as per the Governmental policy.
